# The Power of the Holy Spirit

In the passage we heard from John's Gospel (John 15:26-27), Jesus addressed His disciples. The disciples heard Jesus' words from the beginning of His ministry while He was with them. Jesus' speech took place on the night before He was crucified. The disciples were so concerned about their future. Jesus knew about their concern and encouraged them with a promise of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' mentioning of the Holy Spirit had a purpose. One of the Spirit's roles in the life of a believer is to provide courage in the face of persecution. Suffering often brings doubt. The Holy Spirit will testify to the truth of Jesus within believers and through believers to those who persecute them and others who witness the persecution.

Jesus knew the disciples would not understand what He said in this passage. They did not understand why Jesus was going to die. After Pentecost, the disciples remembered Jesus' words.

Jesus warned the disciples that they would face trials and persecution, but He didn't tell them about the nature and sources of their trials. It was not clear to the disciples that the Holy Spirit would come and give them comfort. Jesus knew that the Holy Spirit would bring the disciples to the truth. But He did teach them what the Holy Spirit would be and do after His ascension.

Jesus' earthly ministry revealed the presence of the Holy Spirit. But at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was fully revealed as a constant presence, comforter, and counsellor for us, His people.

Most of us understand sin to be about behaviour, but the Holy Spirit knows sin is really about unbelief. Sometimes the most difficult thing to accept is that we've been wrong all along. That's because we have a natural tendency to defend our decisions at all cost. But when the time comes, and we're confronted with the truth, accepting it can be so hard. That's why it's so hard for people to accept Christ as their Saviour. Doing so would mean that everything they have believed in up to now is wrong. We have to be humble enough to admit what's true when we're faced with it, even if it means we're wrong (Mea Culpa). It's better to be late to the truth than to live a lie! Mea Culpa means "through my fault" or "I apologise" and we use it every day in our Mass as we confess our sins. This acceptance of truth is crucial for our spiritual growth, motivating us to strive for a deeper understanding.

- 1. Obtain an Application form from Fr. Antony. The Parish Surgery is open on Fridays at 3pm and again at 8pm.
- 2. Submit your completed application form to the Parish Office, along with proof of Catholicism of at least one parent and all Godparents. Evidence can be a copy Baptism Certificate, Marriage Certificate in a Catholic Church or Letter from a Priest.
