Catholic FAITH [Part 11] THE CREEDS [CCC 185 to 197]

The Creeds are short summaries of the essential truths of the Christian faith. They have been used since the early Church, especially for those preparing for Baptism. The two most important Creeds are the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed.

The Apostles' Creed is considered a faithful summary of the apostles' faith and is the ancient baptismal symbol of the Church of Rome. The Nicene Creed comes from the first two ecumenical Councils and is shared by many Churches today. Both Creeds are important for understanding and deepening our faith.

- Creeds are summaries of the Christian faith, expressing what we believe.
- They are divided into three parts, focusing on the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- The Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed are the two most important Creeds in the Church.
- Saying the Creed with faith connects us to God and the Church.

Questions for Discussion: Which part of the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed is most meaningful to you, and why?

Should we offer Holy Mass for the dead?

We can have Masses offered for those we've lost. No prayer is more powerful than the Mass, and there is no greater way to show our love for our dear departed than to have Masses

said for them. In the Mass, not only their families but the whole Church pray for them. This is the ancient teaching of the Church, and the ancient practice of the faithful. Writing in the sixth century, Pope St. Gregory the Great noted that:

The holy Sacrifice of Christ, our saving Victim, brings great benefits to souls even after death, provided their sins can be pardoned in the life to come. For this reason the souls of the dead sometimes beg to have Masses offered for them.

How to request a Holy Mass Intention. Find the Mass Intention envelopes in front of Our Lady Chapel. Complete the envelope, (the diocesan suggested offering is £10) and place it in the box kept there.

How to Look after the Holy Cross Palm Trees during this Summer: Place in a light area out of direct sunlight, as this will damage the leaves.

The growing medium should be moist, but allow it to dry out a little between waterings.

A lower temperature could affect the plant, they prefer a warm climate and are sensitive to draughts. Areca palms are best kept indoors. This plant humidifies air so making it ideal for offices or homes
