UNICEF Rights Respecting School



This week, as part of our UNICEF Rights Respecting School work, we focused on Refugee Week. We explored what it means to be a refugee, the reasons why people are forced to leave their homes, and the significant contributions refugees have made to the UK. We learned about famous refugees such as Mo Farah, an Olympic gold medallist, and Rita Ora, a renowned singer, both of whom have enriched British culture and society. Our discussions were linked to UNICEF Articles 22, which ensures special protection and humanitarian assistance for refugee children, and Article 38, which protects children affected by armed conflict.

For homework, students are asked to think about what they would pack in their backpack if they had to leave their home suddenly and the reasons for their choices. This activity helps to foster empathy and understanding for the difficult decisions that refugees must make.
