We continue to have extremely high behavioural expectations and instead will focus on positive behaviour. Research shows that a child will repeat a behaviour if it is being rewarded. In each class we have a superstar board, which the if the children are demonstrating ready, respectful or responsible behaviour, then their name goes on the star. At the end of each day every child on the star gets a round of applause from their class mates. Please ask your child if they have made it on the 'superstar' board today!
