Breck Foundation Parent Online Session





Composer of the Week: Franz Joseph Haydn



This week, we have been exploring the life and music of Joseph Haydn, our Composer of the Week. Known as the "Father of the Symphony" and "Father of the String Quartet," Haydn was a pivotal figure in the development of classical music during the 18th century. His works are full of creativity, charm, and wit, with famous pieces like the "Surprise Symphony" and "The Creation" leaving a lasting legacy. Haydn's

compositions laid the groundwork for future composers such as Mozart and Beethoven.
