

Key Vocabulary

Neutral colours		Black, brown, grey and white. They can come in different shades but contain only a little colour.
Tint		Is where a colour is added to white to make a lighter version of that colour.
Shade		Is where black is added to a colour to make it darker.
Abstract		Is modern art that uses line, colour and shape. It does not represent images of our everyday world.
Line drawing		Is any image that is made up of straight or curved lines on a light background.
Shading		Makes objects look more 3 dimensional by making colours lighter or darker to show light or a shadow. Often done with a pencil.
Perspective		The further an object is away the smaller it looks. It creates something called depth. in a picture and objects look more 3 dimensional.
Background		The land furthest away from you in a picture. It often includes the sky.
Middle ground		This is the middle part of a picture. Objects in this area often look smaller.
Foreground		The land or objects closest to you in a picture.

Primary colours are colours in their own right. They cannot be made by mixing other colours together.



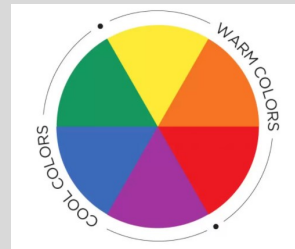
Secondary colours are made by mixing primary colours in equal amounts.



Tertiary colours are made when a primary colour is mixed with a secondary colour.



The Colour Wheel: Warm colours make you think of warm things such as the sunshine or heat. They are colours that energise us and make us happy.



Cool colours can calm and soothe us. They remind us of the water and the sky, even ice and snow.
