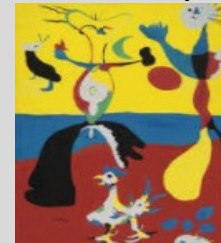


Modern Japanese anime and Manga comics were influenced by the work of Hokusai!

Hokusai (1760-1849) was a printmaker working in Nineteenth century Japan, most famous for The Wave.



Juan Miro (1893-1983) was a Spanish artist, famous for his strange and bold shapes and figures.



Van Gogh (1853-1890) was Dutch. He never sold a single painting, but eventually changed the course of Western art.

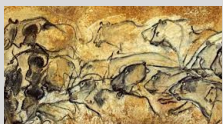


Sonia Delaunay (1875-1979) worked in Paris. She used painting to help her design colourful textiles and fashion.

Key Vocabulary

still life		An arrangement of objects on a table.
observation		Looking closely at the different details.
foreground		Objects at the front of the picture.
composition		How a picture is structured.
primary colours		Red, yellow, and blue. They cannot be made by mixing other colours together.
secondary colours		Colours such as green or purple, that are made by mixing primary colours together.
hue		Shades of colour: how dark or light a colour is.
colour wheel		These show the different hues of primary and secondary colours.
printing		Making pictures with rollers and, not brushes.
ink		A thick and coloured sticky liquid used instead of paint to create prints.

Artist's materials

Viewfinders	Ink	Paints	Brushes
Viewfinders are a very useful tool for choosing which part of an image you want to focus on, so you can look closely!	Printing is a way of making pictures without brushes. Print makers like Hokusai use rollers to spread out their ink, and give the colour a flat texture.	Artists like Vincent van Gogh and Miro used thick oil paints. Artists like Sonia Delaunay use water colours, which are much lighter, and dry faster.	Brushes come in all shapes and sizes. Use large brushes for filling big spaces in the background, like the sky. Use small, finer brushes for close up details, like the colour of
