Exciting News: Sunday Bible Classes Starting in Our Parish!

We are glad to announce the start of Sunday Bible classes in our parish! These classes will be held every 1st and 3rd Sunday after the 9 a.m. Mass in Hartley Hall during the school term.

The first session will take place this Sunday. The classes are open to children, young people, and adults. Together, we will explore the teachings of the Bible through action songs, engaging videos, and group discussions.

Everyone is welcome to join us for this enriching experience. We look forward to seeing you there!

This week, we are excited to restart the 'Catholic Faith' section after a short break. Please take some time to read and reflect on it. I also invite you to discuss and reflect on the question provided in the 'Family Discussion' section with your families. Let's engage in meaningful conversations and deepen our understanding of our faith together.



Summary: This section of the Catechism of the Catholic Church focuses on Jesus Christ, the central figure of Christianity. It explores His divine nature as the Son of God and His human nature as the Savior sent by God to redeem humanity. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection fulfil the promises made in the Old Testament.

The title "Lord" is a divine title attributed to Jesus, recognizing His supreme authority and power. It is used in Christian prayer and expressions of adoration. The name of Jesus is invoked in prayer, as a source of hope, healing, and salvation.

Understanding the person of Jesus Christ is essential for Christian faith. It involves recognizing His divinity, His humanity, and His role as the Savior of the world. By knowing and loving Jesus, Christians are called to follow His example, live in communion with Him, and share His message with others.

Question for Family Discussion: How does understanding that Jesus is both God and human impact your relationship with Him?

Bible Verses to Remember [Phil 2:9-11]: Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus, every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father



All Saints' Day [Friday, 01 November 2024]: In two weeks, we will celebrate the feasts of All Saints' Day on Friday, 1st November, and All Souls' Day on Saturday, 2nd November. On both days we will hold an additional morning Mass.

All Saints' Day Mass Times: 9:15am and 7pm All Souls' Day Mass Times: 9:15am and 6:30pm Every year, we celebrate **All Saints' Day** with great joy as **our children dress up as saints.** I encourage you to continue this tradition during both Masses on Sunday, 3rd November. May our children always be inspired by the holiness of the Saints, as opposed to the more secular celebrations of **Halloween**.

You may find the costumes of saints online. Please remember that All Saints' Day is a Holy Day of Obligation.
