Thank you to all the parents that attended the online session on Monday from the Breck Foundation. The whole staff had a further training session on Tuesday and the content has certainly had the whole staff team talking. I have put the link below for the parent session, which was recorded and is now available to for you watch until next Tuesday. It makes you aware that our very precious children could be targeted by

strangers wanting to groom them. Some of the statistics that were spoken about are frightening, over 70% of teenagers are groomed on social media sites such as Snapchat and Instagram. As parents we need to check that they only engage online with people that they have met and know well. I would really ask that you think carefully about when your children have access to social media sites, including WhatsApp. These sites are for young people who are over the age of 13. The children in KS2 had workshops about online safety, their sessions were really informative, please speak to your children for more information about these.

Booking for Parents Evening is open and many slots have already been filled. If you are having any issues with the online system please see staff in the School Office who will be able to help you.


Harvest Festival

Composer of the Week: Ignatius Sancho



This week, in celebration of Black History Month, our Composer of the Week is Ignatius Sancho. Born into slavery in 1729, Sancho overcame incredible challenges to become a notable figure in British history, excelling as a composer, writer, and abolitionist. He is remembered as the first person of African descent to vote in a British parliamentary

election and is celebrated for his work in advocating for the abolition of the slave trade. Sancho's compositions, though lesser known, are significant in British musical history, combining classical styles with influences from his African heritage.

UNICEF Rights Respecting School



This week, as part of our UNICEF work and Black History Month, we explored the theme of "Reclaiming Narratives," linked to Article 2 (non-

discrimination) and Article 30 (rights of children from minority communities). In assembly, we learned about inspiring Black figures such as Olympic athlete Alice Coachman, environmental activist Wangari Maathai, and poet Benjamin Zephaniah, all of whom have made significant contributions in their fields. The theme encourages us to correct historical inaccuracies and celebrate the full complexity of Black heritage.
