














Mozart was only 31 when he died. He was so poor that they could not pay for his funeral. He was given a pauper's grave, so no one knows where it is.

Later, the people of Vienna built this memorial to him.















Unlike any other musical composer in history he wrote excellent music in all the musical genres (types or categories) of his day.
















His music is played often today and many of his works are used on television. His operas are still performed regularly, the most popular being:
