Dear Parishioners,

In this week, we reflect on the miracle at the wedding at Cana. This event isn't just a story about a miracle; it's a blueprint for how we should live as a parish family. Imagine the scene: a celebration, joy, and then suddenly, a problem – the wine runs out. What happens next is crucial. Mary notices the need, and she doesn't hesitate to act. She brings the problem to Jesus.

This is what we're called to do for each other, to be attentive to the needs around us. The quiet struggles, the unspoken anxieties, maybe it's a family facing financial hardship, someone battling loneliness, or a parishioner overwhelmed by illness. Just like Mary, we can be the ones who notice, who care, who bring those needs to Christ – and to each other.

We have the power to turn ordinary moments into extraordinary ones, to transform lack into abundance, not with miraculous wine, but with the gifts God has given us: compassion, generosity, and a willingness to serve. A helping hand, a listening ear, a warm meal – these are the ways we turn water into wine in our own community.

This week, let's be inspired by the wedding at Cana. Let's be attentive to the needs of our fellow parishioners, offering support and love in practical ways. By doing so, we become channels of Christ's grace, transforming our parish into a place where everyone feels truly welcomed and cared for.

Six Dimensions of the Jubilee Year 2025

Based on his pronouncements of Pope Francis and the historical context of the Jubilee years, we can identify six interconnected dimensions:

- 1. **Spiritual Renewal:** At its core, the Jubilee is a time for profound spiritual renewal, a return to God's mercy and a deepening of our relationship with him. This involves pilgrimage, prayer, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and a renewed commitment to living the Gospel.
- 2. **Hope:** Pope Francis has designated 2025 as the "Jubilee of Hope," emphasizing the need to foster hope in a world marked by challenges and uncertainty. This involves recognizing God's presence in our lives, trusting in his promises, and working to build a more just and compassionate world.

- 3. **Reconciliation:** Jubilee years have traditionally been associated with forgiveness and reconciliation. This dimension calls us to seek forgiveness for our sins, to extend forgiveness to others, and to work for healing and reconciliation in our families, communities, and the world.
- 4. **Solidarity with the marginalized:** A key aspect of Jubilee years is a focus on justice and care for the poor and marginalized. This involves actively reaching out to those in need, advocating for their rights, and working to create a more inclusive and equitable society.
- **5.** Care for Creation: Pope Francis has repeatedly emphasized the importance of caring for our common home. This dimension of the Jubilee calls us to recognize the interconnectedness of all creation, to live sustainably, and to protect the environment for future generations.
- **6.** Pilgrimage: Journeying to Rome or other holy sites is a traditional practice during Jubilee years. This physical pilgrimage symbolizes our spiritual journey towards God and our commitment to living out the values of the Gospel.

Coach Pilgrimage to Diocesan Holy Places

Did you know that over 100 saints are from our diocese alone. We are organising pilgrimages to visit some of these holy places; the first trip will be on Saturday 22nd February 2025.

And we will be visiting Aylesford, Rochester, Faversham, Canterbury and Ramsgate. If you would like to attend, please email your name/s to catfordsupport@rcaos.org.uk.

At Aylesford we will see the Shrine of our Lady of Mount Carmel and Saint Simon Stock. Rochester has always been associated with the early Saints: - Paulinus, Ithamar and William of Perth and of course John Fisher, and in Faversham, Saints Crispin and Crispinian are very special, as is Saint Jude, the patron saint of hopeless cases! Upon visiting Canterbury, we learn there are quite a number of well-known saints, including Saint Augustine, Saint Thomas Beckett, St Anselm, St Mildred... the list goes on. Finally, in Ramsgate we will see the Shrine of St Augustine of Canterbury, which is where he first landed on English soil from Rome in the year 597, and his apostolic mission began.

Parents who would like to baptise their children, please follow these steps:

- 1. Obtain an Application form from Fr. Antony. The Parish Surgery is open on Fridays at 3pm and again at 8pm.
- 2. Submit your completed application form to the Parish Office, along with proof of Catholicism of at least one parent and all Godparents. Evidence can be a copy Baptism Certificate, Marriage Certificate in a Catholic Church or Letter from a Priest.
- 3. Completion of an on-line Baptism Course, a link will be sent to you which will contain Baptism preparation videos. The Parish Office will guide you once you have submitted your application form.
- 4. After the above requirements have been met, you will be asked to select a date for your child's Baptism.
