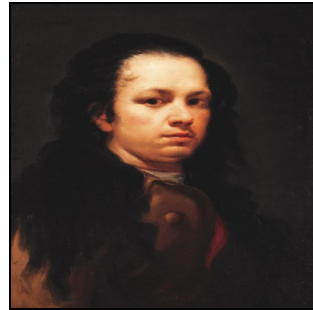
Did you know?

The Incredible Hulk should be grey not green but during printing, there were problems.

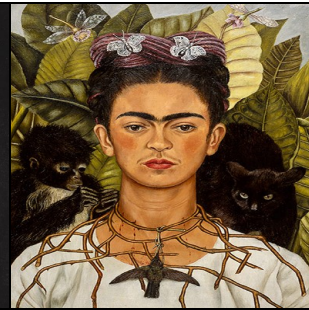
Key Vocabulary		
arrange		The composition or collection of visual elements in an artwork.
Batik		The method of hand-printing on fabric by coating with wax the parts not to be dyed.
fix		Something that fixes, protects, or preserves media to an artwork.
hammering		A technique where metal is shaped or patterned by hitting it with a hammer.
Hapa-Zome		A Japanese technique of naturally dying materials by smashing flowers and leaves onto it.
pattern		A design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated. Patterns can be regular or irregular.
relief		A technique where sculpted parts remain attached to a 2D background of the same material.
shape		An element of art that is two-dimensional, flat, or limited to height and width.
texture		How something feels, including its appearance and consistency. Different materials have different textures.

Did you know?

Henri Rousseau was a self trained painter and, although his paintings depicted far away places, he never travelled outside of France, capturing images from frequent trips to the Jardin de Plantes and its zoological galleries.



Francisco Goya was a Spanish romantic painter and printmaker.



Frida Kahlo was a Mexican painter known for her many portraits works inspired by the nature of Mexico.



Diego Rivera was a prominent Mexican painter. His large frescoes helped establish the mural movement in international art.



Diego Velázquez was a Spanish painter, the leading artist in the court of King Philip IV of Spain and Portugal.

Printing Techniques



block printing

Block printing is one of the oldest types of printmaking. It is traditionally intricate patterns made from wooden blocks printed onto textiles.



collagraph print

Collagraph printing is where textures and materials are used to create a block suitable to print.



lino print

Lino print is when a design is cut into the lino surface with a cutter, the lino sheet is inked with a roller, and then impressed onto a surface.



mono print

Mono printing uses a shape, line or image made into the block that can only be printed using one colour.



screen print

Screen printing is the process where an image is transferred onto paper or fabric applying ink and pressing it through the mesh with a squeegee.
