

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday's readings paint a powerful picture of what it means to be a disciple. Isaiah, in his vision of God's holiness, is overwhelmed by his own unworthiness. Yet, through God's purifying touch, he is transformed and responds to the call to serve.

Similarly, the disciples in the Gospel, despite toiling all night and catching nothing, trust in Jesus' words and cast their nets again. Their obedience leads to an abundant catch, symbolizing the countless souls they will bring to Christ.

These readings challenge us to reflect on our own discipleship. We may feel inadequate, like Isaiah, or discouraged, like the fishermen. But God's grace empowers us, just as it did for them. We are all called to be missionary disciples, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with those around us. This doesn't require grand gestures or heroic feats. It starts with small acts of love,

kindness, and witness in our daily lives.

Let us be inspired by Isaiah's courage and the disciples' trust. Let us say "Here I am!" to the Lord, offering our lives as instruments of his love and grace.

How to spiritually prepare for the Holy Mass?

7 Steps to Deepen Your Encounter with God during the Mass.

The Mass is the source and summit of our Christian life. It's where we encounter Christ in the Eucharist and unite ourselves with his sacrifice. To help you prepare for this sacred celebration, here are seven steps, inspired by the teachings of the Catholic Church:



- 1. **Quiet Reflection:** Before heading to church, take a few moments for quiet prayer or meditation. Centre yourself and prepare your heart to meet the Lord. Perhaps read the daily readings or spend time in Adoration.
- 2. **Arrive Early:** Arriving a few minutes early allows you to find a seat, gather your thoughts, and prepare for the celebration. Use this time to quiet your mind and enter into a prayerful state.
- 3. **Examine Your Conscience:** Reflect on your thoughts, words, and actions.

Ask God's forgiveness for any ways you have fallen short. You might consider using an examination of conscience guide.

4. **Make a Spiritual Communion:** If you cannot receive the Eucharist, unite yourself spiritually with Christ through prayer and desire. Express your longing to receive him and invite him into your heart.



- 5. **Offer Your Intentions:** Bring your prayers and concerns to the altar in prayer. Offer your participation in the Mass for a specific intention, such as a loved one in need or a particular challenge you are facing.
- 6. **Minimize Distractions:** Put away your phone and other distractions. Be fully present to the mystery unfolding before you. Engage all your senses in the liturgy: listen to the readings and prayers, observe the gestures and symbols, and sing with your whole heart.
- 7. **Open Your Heart:** Come to Mass with an open heart, ready to receive God's grace and encounter his love. Allow the Holy Spirit to work within you and transform you.
